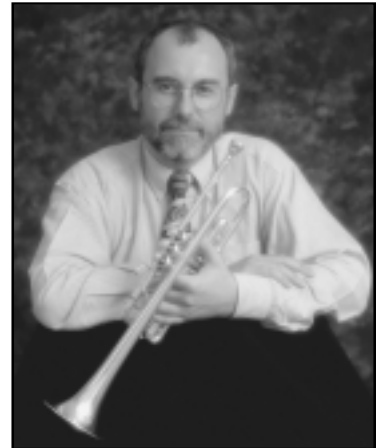


2000 ITG Conference

In addition, three Millennium Panel discussions, featuring some of the most highly-regarded performers of our time, will reflect on brass playing during the 20th Century. For those wishing to take an extended holiday, Lincoln Center, Carnegie Hall, Museum of Modern Art, Metropolitan Museum of Art, Broadway, and New York's great jazz clubs are just 40 minutes away in Manhattan.
