the Brass Band at the University of North Texas and is a Yamaha and Denis Wick Performing Arrist.

Within ITG, Brianne has presented over 25 sessions since 2017, serves as on-site registration coordinator, has contributed articles to the *ITG Journal*, and judged competitions. Her students engage actively as ITG Conference volunteers, scholarship recipients, and competitors.

Brianne co-founded Yoga for All Musicians, a virtual studio addressing musicians' specific physical and emotional needs. She has published scholarly research on yoga and stress management for music educators and holds certifications in yoga, performing arts medicine, and traumainformed mindfulness.

laborations with emerging composers and those from underrepresented demographics. His award-winning projects have been praised as "an inspiring example of forward-thinking classical music culture," commissioning and recording music by some of our time's most vibrant composers, including Katy Abbott, Dai Fujikura, Jennifer Higdon, Leilehua Lanzilotti, and Michael Frazier.

Currently associate professor of music performance at the University of Melbourne, Joel has also held faculty positions at Brandon University (Canada) and the Juilliard School's campus in Tianjin (China). A member of ITG for over 25 years, Joel has had the pleasure of authoring articles for the ITG Journal and performing at conferences as a student in a prelude ensemble, leading a group of his own students in a prelude performance, and as a presenter. He has served on the board and as treasurer of the Australian Trumpet Guild, an ITG affiliate chapter, for the past decade, making a concerted effort to invigorate activities in the interest of knowledge sharing, camaraderie, and the creation of learning opportunities.

DAVID COLLINS is professor of trumpet at the Royal Irish Academy of Music and trumpeter



with the Irish Chamber Orchestra. He currently serves as a member of the board of directors of ITG and the National Youth Orchestra of Ireland. He has held positions as head of wind, brass and percussion at RIAM,

Dublin, and second trumpet and principal cornet with the Ulster Orchestra in Belfast. He performs, tours and records with orchestras including the National Symphony Orchestra of Ireland, Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra, and the World Orchestra for Peace.

David was raised in County Kildare, Ireland, and continued his studies at RSAMD, Glasgow, with Peter Franks and Mark O'Keeffe and Sibelius Academy, Helsinki, with Pasi Pirinen. His orchestral training included tours with the European Union Youth Orchestra performing at the BBC Proms, across Europe and Asia.

As founder and artistic director of Dublin Brass Week, David has hosted many of the biggest names in the brass playing world since 2013 with hundreds of brass students attending and performing in masterclasses, concerts and competitions in Dublin. David recently presented a session at the 2023 ITG Conference in Minneapolis on "Physical and Mental Warmup for Positive Performance."

Statement of Platform: I grew up in Ireland as an active ITG member from a distance, receiving quarterly journals and always with a wish to attend a full conference in person. In 2021 I had the opportunity to be directly involved with ITG as co-host of the ITG Ellsworth Smith International Trumpet Competition in Ireland alongside Jason Bergman. Reaching international members has always been a personal aim and

since joining the ITG board I have formed a network of pre-professional European trumpeters and universities as part of my work with the ITG Membership Committee. For me, one of ITG's most inspiring elements is international collaboration, which is why engaging trumpet players from across Europe in our global trumpet community is so crucial. ITG has become a core part of my life-meeting and collaborating with trumpeters from across the world is fundamental to what ITG stands for. It has been a privilege to hear not only the best trumpet players in the world right now, but also the next generation of players at collegiate competitions during each annual conference. I would love the opportunity to continue my work with the ITG board with a focus on encouraging greater European participation and closer connections within ITG.

LUIS ENGELKE is professor of trumpet at Towson University and principal trumpet of the



Lancaster, Kennett, Mid-Atlantic Symphony Orchestras, Baltimore Chamber Orchestra, and Shippensburg Music Festival. He performs over 100 engagements annually as a soloist and orch-

estral/chamber musician. His past solo albums— A Brazilian Collection; Songs, Remembrances, and Impressions; Sounds of the Chesapeake; and Revelation: Ten Original Works for Trumpet and Fixed Media—have received critical acclaim and many awards. A former member of Orquestra Sinfônica Brasileira, he has performed with more than fifty professional orchestras internationally including the symphonies of Allentown, Baltimore, Delaware, Harrisburg, Maryland, Reading, Richmond, Phoenix, San Diego, York, Williamsburg, and Sydney (Australia), Concert Artists of Baltimore, Thailand Philharmonic, Delaware Opera Orchestra, Opera Baltimore Orchestra, and Annapolis Opera Orchestra. He has also performed with such diverse musicians as Andrea Bocelli, Sierra Boggess, Celtic Woman, Irish Tenors, Il Divo, Mannheim Steamroller, London's The Rock Orchestra, and The Moody Blues. Engelke's more than 350 publications include articles in the Jazz Educators Journal, College Music Symposium, NACWPI Journal, The Double Reed, The International Musician, and Triad. Art of Sound, Balquhidder Music, EC Schirmer, Hickman Music Editions, Triplo Press, and Topp Brass (Switzerland) have published his compositions, arrangements, and editions.

Statement of Platform: For over 35 years, ITG has been a pivotal organization in my career. As a student, the organization provided opportu-

nities through scholarship and solo competitions and inspiration through the annual conferences and journals. These opportunities led to an intense passion for ITG, and this longtime commitment has included serving as a past board member, Music Reviews Editor for almost 27 years, chair of the Ellsworth Smith Committee, numerous ITG Journal articles, and countless conference performances and presentations, including three full solo recitals. Perhaps most importantly, serving as chair of the Commissions Committee for 13 years, a focus has been ethnically and culturally diverse music that includes gender diversity. These commissions have included Clarice Assad, Michael Daugherty, R. Carlos Nakai, Wang Ning, Lakshminarayana Subramaniam, Omar Thomas, Julian Wachner, and Gwyneth Walker. Bringing these compositions to our membership through Journal articles and supplements beyond conference premieres has been imperative. As a board member, my priorities would include rebuilding and increasing membership; promoting diversity, equity, and inclusion through an expanded repertoire; increasing an international presence; finding ways to serve all our members (both professional and amateur); maintaining financial sustainability; adapting to a changing musical and educational landscape; and highlighting the relevance and importance of the Journal.

ANNE MCNAMARA is the associate professor of trumpet at Illinois State University, where



she teaches applied trumpet and performs in the Faculty Brass Quintet. She performs as a freelance trumpeter including principal trumpet with the Heartland Festival Orchestra and performances with the Sin-

fonia de Camera, Illinois Symphony Orchestra, Champaign-Urbana Symphony, and on flugelhorn with the Athena Brass Band. A strong supporter of new music, her album, *A Winter's Night*, features two of her commissions, Carson Cooman's flugelhorn sonata and the flugelhorn adaptation of Kevin McKee's *A Winter's Night*. Recently, Anne commissioned *Thoughts and Prayers* by Roy Magnuson, a protest piece about gun violence. Anne is a Yamaha performing artist.

An active member of ITG, Anne served as the chair of the Young Artist Award committee, writing an article each issue of the journal from 2019 – 2024 and she has published two articles outlining the history and collective experience of non-male trumpet professors in June 2022 and March 2024. Anne has presented at the ITG Conference on her research, performed on two

New Works recitals, presented a non-pro warmup class and masterclass, and led a regular warmup class. Recently she served on the ITG Artist Selection Committee for the upcoming 2025 conference.

Statement of Platform: I have been a proud member of the International Trumpet Guild for many years as I firmly believe in it as an educational resource. The depth of knowledge in its journals, its archives, and in its membership is invaluable! As a teacher, I love helping my students grow, both as trumpeters and as people. I strive to foster student growth by creating a safe environment so students feel comfortable taking musical risks and learning from one another. This is done by creating a culture that values empathy, vulnerability, and selflessness. If I am elected to the board of directors, I would bring this set of values into my work for ITG, continuing to help provide the high quality content, to seek out voices representing all ages and backgrounds in our membership, and to celebrate the many successes across our trumpet community. I also pride myself in being highly organized and task driven and I would happily bring this skill set to my work on the board.

KYLE MILLSAP is professor of trumpet and jazz at Texas A&M University-Kingsville. He is a



versatile musician, having performed throughout the USA and internationally with several symphony orchestras, chamber groups, and a variety of touring acts. He has commercially available solo

and ensemble recordings as both a performer and conductor/producer and has published a warm-up method book and an etude book.

He has been a longtime member of the International Trumpet Guild, first joining almost 30 years ago. One of his first actions at TAMUK was to establish an ITG affiliate chapter, which established the annual South Texas Trumpet Workshop. He gave presentations at several conferences, performed as a soloist and in the Festival of Trumpets. His students performed at numerous conferences. In service to ITG, he has served on the conference artist committee, been a panel chair for a youth competition division, a conference reporter, scholarship adjudicator, Affiliate Chapter Zone Coordinator, and contributed articles, interviews, and music reviews to the Journal. Outside of ITG, he is an active clinician, has given presentations at the CMS and NACWPI National Conferences and TMEA Convention, and been an adjudicator for NTC and all levels of TMEA and TNMEA.

Statement of Platform: It is an honor to be considered to serve on the ITG Board of Direct-

ors. There is a legacy that anyone trusted with such a position must be willing to uphold. My commitment to that legacy will revolve around two areas: adaptability and awareness. As the international organization for the trumpet, ITG has an obligation to showcase the full potential of the trumpet. The trumpet's use is not limited to band and orchestra. In South Texas, for example, the trumpet is a key component in the rich traditions of Latin Jazz, mariachi, banda, and Tejano music. repertoire. Dr. Simoes combines his performance and teaching experience to create a supportive and engaging learning environment.

Simoes is an active member of the International Trumpet Guild, contributing in various ways to the community. He has presented warm-up sessions at conferences, coordinated the Festival of Trumpets since 2023, and served as interim chair of the Youth Competitions. He has also helped establish three ITG affiliate chapters in the US and Brazil to connect trumpet players worldwide. Currently, he is the editor of the "Orchestral Spotlight" column in the ITG Journal.

Committed to promoting Latin American music, Simoes has worked on projects like recording an album of new works by Brazilian composers and helping facilitate international teaching and performing collaborations. His approach to teaching and performing emphasizes authenticity, connection, and fostering a love for music. He values the opportunity to inspire others while continually learning and growing as a musician and educator.

Statement of Platform: ITG has long embodied camaraderie, knowledge, and leadership in our community. Since joining in 2010, I've admired ITG's commitment to these values and worked to reflect them in the events I organize.

LUKE SPENCE enjoys a multi-faceted career as a performer, educator, and arts leader. He is a



performing artist for S.E. Shires Co. and Denis Wick and serves on faculty at the SUNY Potsdam Crane School of Music. A firm believer that music has the power to be an agent of social change,

Spence is general manager and founding Board of Directors member for the International Pride Orchestra (IPO), a non-profit that brings together musicians from around the world to present concerts, celebrate community, and raise funds for LGBTQIA+ causes. In just three years, Spence helped IPO grow from a concept into a festival orchestra slated to perform a marquee event in Washington, DC, for WorldPride. Spence has been involved with ITG for years. He's written an article and review for the Journal and had his solo album, 20th Century Art Songs, celebrated as 'exquisite." At recent conferences, he judged competitions and served on two DEI-related discussion panels. Ultimately, Spence considers his work as co-chair of the ITG DEI Committee to be his most meaningful and impactful. Through the committee's collaborative work, it secured more visibility, opportunities, and scholarships for minoritized and underrepresented groups for future conferences.

Statement of Platform: I hope that my experience leading a major arts organization at the executive level will be viewed as a strong asset for the board.
